3. ACTIVITIES OF PORTFOLIO	 Acknowledgement of Country We would like to Acknowledge that the land the AULSS and Adelaide Law School is on today is the traditional lands for the Kaurna people and that we respect their spiritual relationship with their Country. We also acknowledge the Kaurna people as the traditional custodians of the Adelaide region and that their cultural and heritage beliefs are still as important to the living Kaurna people today.



 The AULSS Constitution may be amended every year at the Special General Meeting (SGM). Representatives may submit proposals to the President, to be considered by the Executive as to whether it should go to a vote at the SGM. Executive members may submit proposals to the Executive
 Committee, for consideration as to whether it should go to a vote at the SGM. The Executive received a proposed constitutional amendment from a Committee Member regarding whether Law Society of South Australia's GDLP students should be members of the AULSS, given that this GDLP program is ran on University of Adelaide campus and some of the administration is through the University (although teaching staff etc is external). The Executive thoroughly considered this proposal, including all of the pros and cons, but ultimately rejected it for a number of reasons. Primarily, since some of our major sponsors are other GDLP providers, it would be inappropriate to represent the interests of some GDLP students and not others. This could be viewed as unfair and a conflict of interest.



3.	Co-option Round 3
	 Last Thursday, 19 May 2022, I opened
	applications for the casual vacancies on the
	Committee.
	 I had been notified by the Executive that
	several Committee Members were going on
	Exchange in Semester 2 and could not fulfill
	their outstanding duties until the end of their
	term on 1 December 2022.
	\circ As per clause 75(1) of our
	Constitution, these members provided
	me with a formal notice of resignation
	via email.
	 After a lengthy discussion with the Executive,
	we decided in order to have a smooth
	transition into Semester 2, be able to train
	the new representatives during the mid-year
	break, and allow for all vacancies to be filled
	during the one round of co-option (rather
	than waiting until August when most of the
	Exchange students depart) we decided to
	work pro-actively and have the
	representatives resign effective as of Sunday
	29 May.
	 The timeline of this process was
	chosen in order to fulfill our
	obligations under the Constitution,
	 whilst ensuring a smooth transition. I would like to extend my wholehearted
	gratitude to the following members who will

 At the time of writing this report, the
competitors have not confirmed
their attendance.
The Executive took a more conservative
approach this year in amount they were
willing to cover for the competitors costs in
going, as well as the conference delegates
(Bella and myself).
 In 2019 (the last July conference
attended pre-covid), the Committee
covered the full expense including
registration, flights and
accommodation. The change in cost
cover was justified due to the
AULSS' finances having decreased
since COVID.
\circ In 2022, the Executive approved a
lesser ticket package (\$365) and a
\$100 reimbursement for
discretionary costs.
 I will note that this still leaves a very
large out of pocket costs for
competitors and delegates, which is
why many competitors were hesitant
to go.
Executives reconsider this funding.
Bella and I look forward to representing the
AULSS at a national level, and to bring back
as much information as we can! After all,
there is a lot to learn from some of the bigger
Societies, and we are excited to help the
AULSS grow and expand!

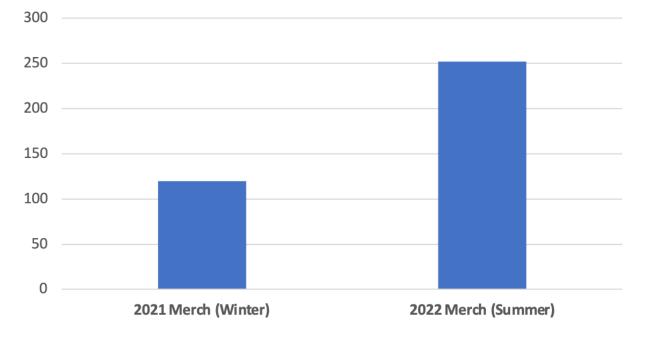

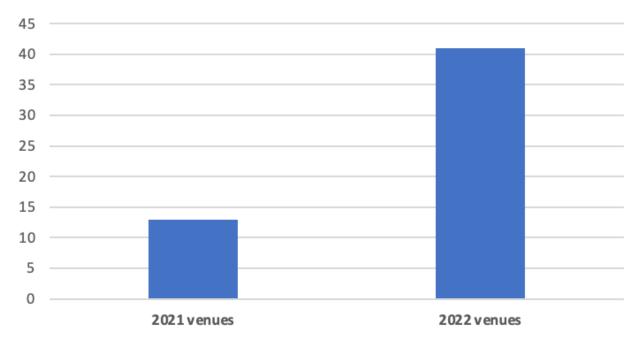

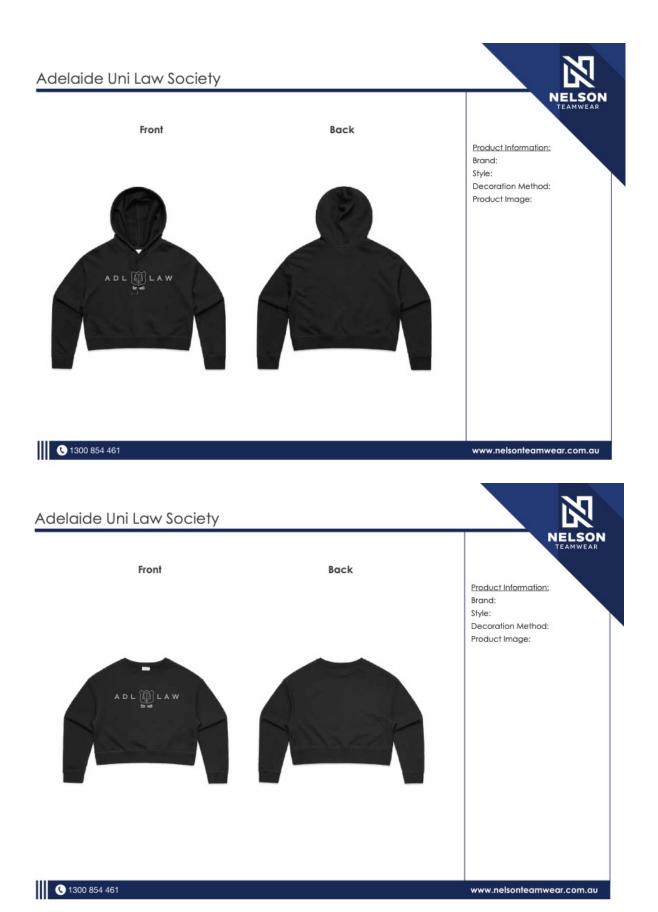

4. DISCUSSION POINTS	 I am pleased to inform the committee that Sponsorship to date stands at \$37,577.67 – we are on our way to record numbers of sponsorship this year. We have had a tough time getting sponsorships in the past two years and we have to continue to strive to keep on with the sponsorships – my goal is that our net position at the end of my term is above \$100,000 so future committees can have more leeway in their expenditure. The committee may not know this, but the executive have had to make a lot of tough decisions regarding where our money goes. Obviously, at the end of the day the judicious use of our funds is paramount, and I believe that deliberations in the committee regarding our finances keeps things transparent. I draw your attention to our balance sheet now for comments. Keeping in line with positivity, we have had a record number of attendees at sponsored events and I would like to thank each and every committee member that has attended these events. 	



I have also had a chat with Career services and this attendance at Sponsored Events can be recognised towards the Adelaide Graduate Award. So if anyone is participating in the award, please contact me or any executive member to sign off on your time and get some tangible benefits from attending these events!

I understand that there have been complaints regarding the inflexible attendance policy, and I can assure you that the intention <u>was</u> for the policy to be inflexible because of what I was advised by previous treasurers.

For your reference, the Sponsorships Director before Imogen Tonkin (our past Treasurer) would be in tears asking for committee members to be at sponsored events – only to be met with complete apathy. Imogen herself would remind people to attend sponsored events and this only picked up towards the end of 2021.

In line with providing people with some recourse and formalising the attendance policy, the Executive have passed the 2022 Attendance Policy which now formally outlines the expectation of committee members regarding attendance at sponsored events. Please bear in mind that this policy is not comprehensive but covers a vast majority of cases where there may be absences; anything that is not covered in the policy is dealt with at the Treasurer's discretion, which can formally be appealed twice for transparency. Once again, I thank the committee for their support in the formulation stage of our attendance policy, which at times seemed dictatorial, unfair and downright impractical. I hope that the formalisation of the attendance policy will provide more certainty to committee members regarding their expectations at

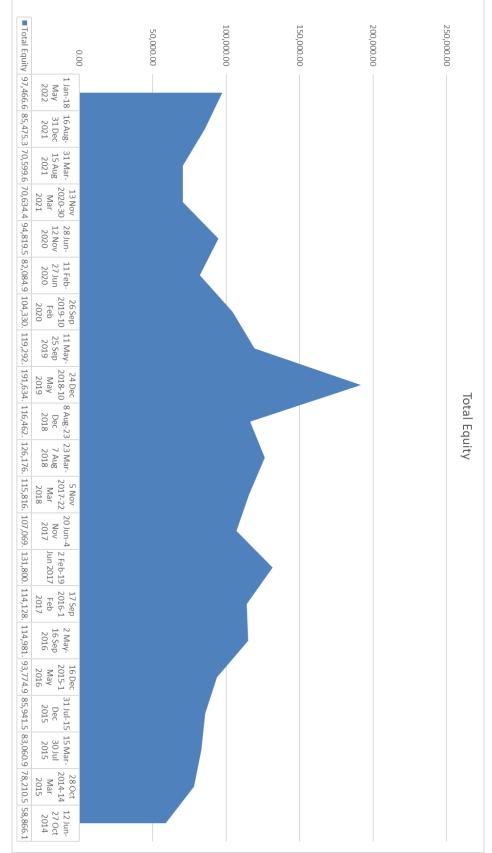

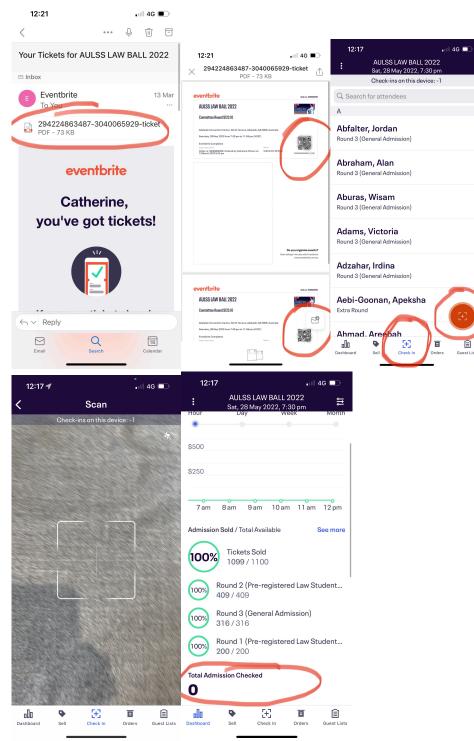
