ACTIVITIES OF PORTFOLIO	1. Co-Option (Round 5) Results:  I would like to congratulate Eleni Sarantou for her successful nomination for the role of Director of Education.  As most of you would know, Eleni was initially elected as an Education Representative in the 2022 Elections. Although her time on the Education Portfolio only spans a couple of months, she, and the rest of the Education Portfolio has worked extremely hard to get their events up and running. I can safely say that the Portfolio is in good hands.  There was a total of 2 nominations for this round of cooptions.  The reasons why Eleni's nomination was successful is outlined in Appendix 1 of this report.  Cirievance Policy:  The Executive Committee has officially passed the amendments to the Grievance Policy.  The amended policy will be uploaded onto the AULSS website very soon.  Uniform Clerkship Scheme:  We officially have a total of 10 firms who have confirmed their participation in the South Australian Uniform Clerkship Scheme. - This year, we have managed to secure Wallmans Lawyers and Tindall Gask Bentley as the two newest additions to the list of firms participating in the Scheme.
- Unfortunately, Mellor Olsson has decided to not participate in the Scheme this year. While the reasonings were not explicit, I suspect it might be due to the low number of applicants they received last year.
- At the time of writing this report, I am still waiting on Adco Legal to confirm their participation. However, it has been a couple of weeks since their last correspondence to me. Therefore, I do not expect them to be participating in the Scheme this year.

### 4. ALSA Updates:

- The official dates for ALSA are 27 July (Thursday) 2 August (Tuesday).
- This year, the conference will be held at the University of Technology in Sydney.
- I will note that the registration prices for ALSA have increased significantly compared to last year's prices.
  - Early-bird registration (starting 26 April): \$730
  - General registration (starting 17 May): \$750
  - This price applies to both council delegates and competitors.
  - Unlike last year where different priced packages were offered, ALSA is offering a single all-inclusive package, which entitles delegates (and competitors, although this will have to be confirmed) to all the events during the conference.
  - Given the registration fee increase, the Executive will have to decide on the amount of subsidies the AULSS will be providing to its delegates and competitors.
  - In 2022, the Executive Committee approved a registration package of \$365 and a total subsidy of \$500 for each of the delegate's and competitor's expenditure. Please refer to Appendix 2 for the total amount the AULSS spent on ALSA last year.
  - I will provide further updates in the next committee meeting.

## 5. Internal Survey/Feedback Update

 Over the mid-semester break, Felix and I conducted an AULSS internal survey to gather some feedback

from our committee members about the operations of their portfolios and the overarching committee. While we only received 15 responses, most of these responses have given us good quality feedback. Overall, the feedback can be summarised as follows: Committee members are generally satisfied with the way that their respective portfolios are run. The average experience rating was 4.33. The same can be said for the committee member's experience with the greater AULSS committee. The average rating for this was Some committee members have noted that there is a slight lack of synergy between the individual portfolios. It was also mentioned that the operation of AULSS largely depends on the elected Directors for the year, which raises concerns with the amount of discretion given to individual Directors. There were a few members who complained about the length of meetings. Communications issues were also raised by a few members. However, some of the good points relate to the overall support the committee members give each other (especially within individual portfolios), and the food provided at each committee meeting. Felix and I, and to a greater extent the Executive Committee, will brainstorm ways to address the issues raised in the survey. I would like to thank those who spent your precious time to send us your feedback. It might be worth considering doing a similar survey directed to the entire Law Student community (see discussion point). 6. Coffee Cart update: Anita Gayen has followed up with the Leasing Section of Infrastructure, and they confirm that a retail review of the North Terrace campus is currently occurring. The outcome is due to be released at the end of April/May. At the moment, they are not looking to replace the coffee cart while the review is taking place. ACTIVITIES OF PORTFOLIO	<ol> <li>Semester 1 Merchandise Sales</li> <li>After a worryingly slow start, merchandise sales for semester 1 performed very well, falling just short of the revenue generated by Semester 1 last year.</li> <li>2023's Sem 1 revenue was: \$1,603.20</li> <li>2022's Sem 1 revenue was: \$1,740.34</li> <li>This year we offered sample sizes of several items for people to try on before they bought items, which was a suggestion from last year.</li> <li>Unfortunately, the samples arrived almost a whole week later than initially agreed upon.</li> <li>Due to this, I took the decision to extend merchandise sales a further week to allow students to try on items. The third week dramatically increased sales, which I believe was linked to the availability of sample sizes.</li> <li>I will likely keep the third week of sales open for semester 2 to boost opportunity to students to purchase merchandise.</li> <li>This year we offered water bottles which unfortunately had a high minimum order quantity (MOQ) of 50 which was not reached meaning that the Society purchased the remainder for its own use.</li> <li>The water bottle purchase was expected when we agreed upon the merchandise range, and I am confident that the remainder will continue to be sold in person from the office over the next few years, and can be used for promotional purposes at events, similar to our keep cups which was part of the intention of offering them.</li> <li>The best performing items were the Crew Necks and Hoodies which is in line with previous years.</li> <li>Surprisingly, the demand for Striped Rugbys reduced dramatically from this time last year.</li> </ol>			

- There were 13 people who opted to purchase the optional postage option.
- The breakdown of purchases was as follows:

Crew Necks: 85Hoodies: 59

Black / Navy Rugbys: 5Striped Rugbys: 14

T-Shirts: 33Water Bottles: 7

 Collection of merchandise items will be announced when the merchandise arrives at the Law School.

#### 2. Law School Local Sales:

- The AULSS has started selling LSL cards to students.
- About 60 cards were sold in the first two days of sales, when we ran a stall.
- Card sales have declined since then, and in light of this, there will be a further stall selling sometime later in the semester.
- 68 cards have been sold as of the time of writing this report.
- Unfortunately, one of the business owners who owned the Argos chain has decided to withdraw from LSL, leading to us losing 8 venues in the process. While this is deeply saddening, the LSL program still remains great value with a variety of providers still in the program.

### 3. AULSS Volunteering Recognition Program Policy:

- The AULSS has formally introduced the Volunteering Recognition Program which will recognise the amazing and necessary volunteering by Committee members that extends beyond their portfolio duties.
- The program works by Directors recording the hours of all Committee members who volunteer for work outside their ordinary duties.
- Typical duties includes: volunteering at stalls for merchandise or O'Week, volunteering to assist competitions, helping collect food for Committee meetings, setting up events.
- The full list of volunteering activities is included within the policy.
- Anyone who surpasses 20 hours of volunteering will be entitled to receive a \$20 reimbursement for their time, and will be presented with an award at the end of the year.
- Anyone who has already done volunteering is eligible to have their hours backdated. If you think you are eligible for this, please let the Director who ran the event know. I have already included people who have assisted with O'Week / ABLE day, and some SJE fundraising stalls.







- Greater portfolio synergy is something we want to further increase to enable the changes to go more smoothly. There have been steps and procedures taken, but unfortunately until they are adopted by the committee as a whole we can't take further steps nor can we accurately gauge the success of the process, so we'd like to implore you to follow procedure where possible.
- To that end, we continue to ask that you please give us as much notice as possible of your initiatives and events as is possible. This has been good across the board but we can improve here more.
- We also ask that particularly for non-AULSS events or initiatives that want to get sponsored that we get sufficient notice, as whilst this can't always be helped It has caused a number of issues thus far, and we want to alleviate any unpredictable but foreseeable disruptions.

## 3. Engagement

- Engagement continues to be a problem across the board, we are still struggling to receive strong numbers from the student body, and whilst there has been improvement, it is still far from optimal.
- Regrettably, engagement from the committee is still sorely lacking. By my estimates, excluding posts that consistently garner outlying levels of engagement (activities event releases, first year rep announcements, photo releases), the amount of engagement we garner is representative of a maximum of a quarter of the committee. These low numbers not only discourage further engagement from members of the student body, but can give a negative outward perception to sponsors.
- This makes it especially important that you as a committee do what we can to boost engagement.
   Please interact with EVERY post in some way, as it will go a long way in reaching out to the student body, both in terms of making events appear as wellattended and anticipated as they are, and in using the algorithm to our advantage.
- Taking a cue from previous years, I will set aside time during my report in the meeting for members in attendance to go through and retroactively like as many posts as possible.
- We are continuing to workshop ways in which we can drive engagement effectively, and would appreciate any ideas, suggestions, or initiatives you can offer.
