Semester 2 Merchandise Update</li> <li>The AULSS is nearly ready to announce its new design for the special 140<sup>th</sup> year anniversary merchandise line.</li> <li>This line of merchandise is intended to appeal to both current Law students and alumni, so if you know anyone who may be interested in getting some nostalgia, please let them know.</li> <li>The likely week that merchandise sales will open will be week 5 and the window to order will likely remain open for 3 weeks to allow sufficient time for people to make their purchases, and for students to come to the office and try on the sample sizes of the items to ensure they buy the best fit.</li> <li>We have successfully enlisted the help of several distinguished alumni to model our existing line of items to appeal to alumni for when the new design is released. We have sourced 5 such alumni thus far. Confirmed alumni who have agreed to participate and who have already sent through images of themselves wearing the merchandise include: Former Federal Court Judge Catherine Branson AC KC, former Federal Cabinet Minister Christopher Pyne, and Dr Rachael Gray KC.</li> <li>Merchandise will be sold in the same manner as Semester 1, whereby an online sales portal through Nelsons Teamwear will be open and people can select an item to be collected from the Law School when ready, or they can have the items posted to them for a small fee.</li> <li>The final details have yet to be agreed upon but broadly the range of items will be similar to Semester 1's options, and considerable care was taken to ensure that prices do not rise considerably so that</li> </ul>	

these items are affordable for most people. Items such as Rugby Tops, Crew Necks, T-Shirts and Hoodies will be in the range.

#### 2. Law School Local Sales:

- Sales of cards will continue in Semester 2 from the AULSS Office and from a stall (likely in Week 4).
- Cards remain \$10 to purchase, with a 10<sup>th</sup> going to charity.
- The full list of participating organisations is on our website, so please check it out and tell all your friends / colleagues to get some.
- If you have any questions about the program please let me know.

### 3. AULSS Constitutional Reform:

- The Executive will start to examine proposed constitutional amendments for our Constitution at the next couple of Executive Meetings.
- If you have any suggested changes at all, whether they relate to your portfolio or are more general in nature, please let either your Director, Bryan, or myself know so that the Executive can discuss them in the leadup to our Special General Meeting (SGM) later in the year.

#### 4. AULSS Election Rule Changes:

- During the end of Semester 1, Bryan and I met with the last AULSS Returning Officer to discuss updating our election rules which were last written in 2018.
- These rules have huge gaps, are barely enforced and need considerable rewriting to bring them up to suitable standards.
- I have been drafting a new set of rules to submit to the Committee for approval, which should be by the next Committee Meeting.
- Likely changes (subject to concurrence by the Executive) will include the addition of an enshrined 'withdrawal' period, simplifies the nomination process, allows for more flexible online campaigning, and better deters rule breakers.

#### 5. First Aid Kit:

- With the departure of external facing staff at the Ligertwood Foyer Office, access to a first aid kit has become problematic in the last few months. To remedy this, I have purchased a first aid kit for the Society which contains basic first aid supplies including band aids.
- This kit can be used for incidents in the Law School (particularly in the Foyer area) and may be signed out for usage at AULSS events.
- I will set up a formal document or roster later which will allow Directors or delegated Committee members





I have taken the opportunity during the holidays to try and build up a new procedure.  I have made a number of large-scale changes to our procedure to try and alleviate these effects.  It is still early days, but unfortunately, we have already hit a few issues due to a failure to comply with the procedure. This was also a consistent issue last semester, with half of the intended documents not only going unused but never being opened and process deadlines consistently not being met. There has been some improvement this semester already, but sadly still not all the documents have even been opened at time of writing, and even missing single events and initiatives can have major ramifications for our intending calendar and scheduling  Changes to posting times and amounts have drawn positive results, and further implementation of a calendar from this meeting onwards will hopefully help streamline this process greater, but we will likely still need to implement more changes to adapt and address more problems as they become more apparent. However, it will be incredibly difficult to maintain these changes without our other processes and deadlines being met.  We ask that you do your best to stick to our process and procedure as it evolves so we can best identify what best practice will be going forward, and please feel free to let us know if you have any feedback that we can use.  In particular, notice is essential. 2 weeks isn't a guideline, or even a bare minimum, we should know of events and posts far before this time, and is an area we'd greatly appreciate improvement in.

- In total, this amounted to 102 successful registrations.
  - This is 2 more than last semester!

- I acted as a judge for witness examination
  - The difficulty with ALSA witness examination is that we appear to be the only law school who does evidence as their final subject of the degree.
  - I think this is a testament to the ability of the competitors in AULSS Witness Examination.
  - I was surprised, however, that some law student societies give their competitors a lot more time to prepare compared to the ALSA Competition (with one LSS giving the competitors 2 days, another giving competitors 2 weeks).
- I also acted as a ghost competitor for the negotiations preliminary rounds the following is my perspective as a competitor:
  - The standard of some negotiations made me feel incredibly proud of the standard of AULSS Competitions
  - However, there was some strong competition and Maddy and Sam should be proud of their efforts.

#### APPENDIX 3: ALSA AGM MOTION

ALSA is a crucial part of the support network available to students. It is part of ALSA's purpose to be accessible to all law students. As such, the Conference is a great opportunity for students to network with others as well as the legal professionals who attend. The Conference also hosts an array of competitions, many of which aren't accessible for law schools to send competitors elsewhere.

However, the increasing cost of Conference has and will continue to place a strain on this accessibility and limit the students who can attend. For competitors particularly, many LSS/As send competitors to ALSA as part of their competitions calendar and for many LSS/As it is the only competition where competitors for Witness Examination, Client Interview and Negotiations are sent. If the prices continue to be this high, it will be unsustainable for many LSS/As to send competitors and compete in the variety of competitions ALSA offers. Many competitors do not want to attend the social events as they have come to compete and often forgo these events to stay at their hotels and prepare.

Furthermore, ALSA, as the national law student representative body, should prioritise its accessibility for all law students, irrespective of their and their law student society's financial ability. As such, competing in ALSA competitions should be available to any student who has shown sufficient ability in their law school's internal selection processes. However, a non-tiered system limits access to ALSA to those who are from a law student society who cannot cover all costs and do not come from an affluent background.

#### **Proposed Motion 1**

Standardise the tiered ticketing system by way of constitutional enshrinement. Ensuring *at least* two ticket types creates more equity among LSS/As.

For example: A competitors package which would allow entry into the competitions as well as a ticket to the Closing Gala and Grand Final with an opt in option for the Break Night Event. An events package would allow entry into the council meetings and all events.

Another solution could include door sales to the events.
