Ultimately the successful applications were ones which were well drafted, descriptive, precise and also demonstrated an understanding of the AULSS, the portfolio and representative position in which they applied for.

- We look forward to working with you all throughout the semester to deliver positive outcomes and initiatives for our students.
- As of 2nd August, we have two casual vacancies on the AULSS which have not been filled. This is the position of ONE Magazine Editor and ONE Aboriginal Representative.
- The AULSS Executive has resolved to open another co-option process for these two positions, and we will co-opt applications at our next Executive meeting on August 16th.

2. AULSS x HAL Interview Series

- We have just released the first interview with the Chief Justice, providing insightful and extremely valuable advice to students.

- This is the first of 7 interviews we have to release, and we hope students will find them useful and illuminating.
- I would like to thank the HAL Committee for connecting the AULSS to the interviewees and to the AULSS Committee and Executive for their support of this initiative.
- I would also like to thank Philip Elmes for all his work in editing these videos and making them suitable for publishing in a professional format and as an approved resource of the University of Adelaide.
- Remaining interviews will be with Sarah Court (Deputy Chair of ASIC), Joel Lisk (Associate and PhD Candidate specialising in Space Law) and Ian Maitland (Maritime Trade and Shipping specialist)

3. Advocacy Working Group

- There has been recognition among some staff that students can have a love-hate relationship with advocacy training is a significant source of stress and dissatisfaction.
- In addition, students value the experience and want it often and early but are often unhappy with the way it is delivered.
- As such, some academics are suggesting having a working party (WP) to review the law school advocacy offerings and make recommendations about how advocacy could be delivered and supported in a sensible, sequential way across compulsory courses at each level.
- At this stage a fact-finding process is underway and then a WP will be formed to assess the data we collect and make recommendations to the Dean.

3. ACTIVITIES OF PORTFOLIO

1. Welcome Back and SGM Thank You

- We intended to postpone this event and combine it with our annual Back to School Party. However, the week before university went back, we went into a 7-day lockdown, with restrictions following in week 1 when the event was supposed to be. Thus, we were left with no choice but to cancel this event entirely.
- We always want to ensure we provide students with great events, especially ensuring they get what they paid for (e.g., an event with dancing and singing).
- We decided it would be best to channel our resources into our upcoming events, which is Quiz Night in week 3 and Law Ball in week 6!

3. Law Ball

- The last few weeks of my life have been consumed by Law Ball!
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions in week 1, we did online pre-registrations via a Google Form for the first time ever:
 - Whilst this made it more accessible for students to pre-register, it meant a lot more work for me as I had to pre-register everyone myself, instead of sharing it over a roster.
 - However, we did see a great deal of pre-registrations, with 370 in total!

- Despite the cancellation of our Mid-Year Students Drinks Night, we really wanted to have an event where students could still meet each other, which is why we have reworked the event into a more relaxed Afternoon Tea.
- At the time of writing this report, we do not have concrete details, as we cancelled the original event on Tuesday morning.

Justice Kirby Seminars</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On the 2nd of August we held two seminars virtually over Zoom with the Honourable Michael Kirby AC CMG. • The first seminar called ‘Introduction to the law- Perspectives from Justice Kirby’ was targeted towards the first and second years. • The turnout was great to see- 46 people at the peak! • It was primarily led by Aditi who facilitated most of the questions and prepared an introduction to the seminar, which was fantastic. • The responses in the chat were very positive.

- The only feedback we received was to consider asking people to submit questions prior to the seminar so less pressure was put on students who might be shy or nervous to speak in front of a judge.
- Our second seminar called 'Key Issues in Australian Law Reform' was targeted at third to final years. We encouraged students to come prepared with some questions and thoughts.
- The turnout was around 40 people (slightly less than the first seminar). It was run by Maddie and Alex, who worked very well together and learned to go with the flow. Some of our initial plans were changed because of Justice Kirby's answers being longer than expected, and other minor technical issues prior to the seminar starting, but both Aditi and Maddie adapted easily.
- Joining us in the second seminar were esteemed guests like David Plater, Lorne Neudorf and John Williams. Combined with the flood of questions that we received from the participants, it felt like there was great engagement overall and once again, there was a lot of positive feedback.
- If anything, it felt like the seminar could have gone for a little longer as there were so many wonderful questions that we were unable to get to.
- I am very happy with the turnout and am hoping that the Social Justice and Equity Portfolio can run something very similar in the future.
